Dear Members and Friends,

On Christmas day, my daughter and I spent six hours in our basement, setting up a new ping-pong table. The two of us learned how to use an electric drill and how to screw together a 300 pound apparatus on which we would eventually bounce a tiny little ball with little tiny paddles. When all the parts were put together we stood up, shook hands and said with big grins, "Who needs a man around when we can do all this ourselves." Then we turned the 300 pounds of wood and metal over, and it collapsed onto the floor, ripping all the screws out in an instant. We looked at each other dumbfounded (and a little teary) and then turned off the lights and went upstairs without another word. Our Annual Meeting will be held on **Sunday, January 24 at 11:30am**. The agenda will include reports from committees, election of officers and committee members and adoption of the budget for 2010. All church members are encouraged to attend this important meeting! Child care/activities will be available beginning at 10:00am and continue thru the Annual Meeting.

January: Epiphany begins with a look at the *practice of wearing skin* as we greet God incarnate in Jesus. Immediately, we move to honor God's prophetic voice in the life of Dr. Martin Luther King. Our worship on this Sunday is always filled with Spiritual Renewal and Gospel Music. On the third Sunday of Epiphany, our community will share a meal together and celebrate 2009 while we prepare to begin this new decade. And the last Sunday of January is dedicated to Jazz and Justice with guest musician Willie Sordillo. We will journey through the last century of jazz music and the spiritual awakening that was ushered in by this genre.

February: Lent begins in the middle of this month with a dinner and Ash Wednesday service. Our theme for the 40 days of Lenten wilderness includes raising our awareness of the impact of Domestic Violence on our communities and connecting to the outside world as healers and peace makers. Meditations, sermons, and workshops about bullying, date rape and the impact of domestic violence will be "bookmarked" by the annual HAWC Irish/Folk concert and the Annual HAWC Walk. Also in Lent we will offer the Artists in Worship Project in the Balcony of the sanctuary.

Come join me, the staff and the leaders of Tabernacle for an amazing season of music, fellowship, worship and outreach.

January/February Worship Themes

January 17, 2010 **MLK Sunday**

Scripture Lessons: 1 Corinthians 12:1-11 and John 2:1-11 Sermon: **The Servants with the Stone Jars**
Paul's letter to the Corinthians concerns spiritual gifts. To each of us is given gifts of the Spirit. Some of us have the gift of wisdom, some the gift of vision, some the gift of healing and others the gift of prophesy. All gifts are from God for the common good. Martin Luther King Jr. shared his spiritual gifts, which were abundant, and changed the course of history for the common good.

January 24, 2010 **Annual Meeting**

Scripture Lesson: Luke 4:14-21 Sermon: **The Authority to Preach**
Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, steps into his ministry. Teaching in synagogues, people praised him for his words and his message. When he returned to his home village Nazareth, he stepped into the pulpit with the words of the prophet Isaiah in his heart. For this hometown crowd, he says, "I am anointed to bring good news to the poor." How do we love beyond our four walls and bring good news.

January 31, 2010 **Jazz Sunday with Willie Sordillo**

Scripture Lessons: Jeremiah 1:4-10 and Luke 4:21-30 Sermon: **Jazz and Justice**
Again, we find Jesus preaching in the synagogue of his hometown. This time, he enrages the town folk to such a degree that they drive him out of town where they want to hurl him off a cliff. Why won't Jesus "perform" miracles for the people in Nazareth? Perhaps he is looking for their faith in God not their fascination in magic. His passion for justice gets him in trouble.

February 7, 2010 **Communion**

Scripture Lessons: Isaiah 6:1-8 and Luke 5:1-11 Sermon: **Calling, Leaving, Following**
Isaiah feels unworthy to be called by God for service. Nevertheless, hearing God's voice saying "Whom shall I send; and who will go for us?" inspires him to accept "Here I am. Send me." Likewise, Jesus meets unassuming, unsuccessful fishermen in their boats and asks them to take him out on the water where he can teach his followers. When he finishes speaking, he encourages the fishermen to let down their nets and catch more fish than ever before. Simon Peter, feeling unworthy to be in the presence of God, falls down at the feet of Jesus who says, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people."

February 14, 2010 **Mardi Gras/Transfiguration Sunday**

Scripture Lessons: Exodus 34:29-35 and Luke 9:28-36 Sermon: **Transformed By New Orleans**
Mountain top experiences in the Bible are always transforming. Moses comes down from Mt. Sinai, his face shining because he had been talking with God. Jesus goes to the mountaintop with three disciples and his face changes while he talks with God. On this Sunday of Black History month, we remember Dr. Martin Luther King's words about the Mountaintop and we can see his face shining because he has been talking with God. Let God astound us this week as we end Epiphany with Mardi Gras Sunday.

February 21, 2010 **Lent 1**

Scripture Lessons: Deuteronomy 26: 1-9 and Luke 4:1-13 Sermon: **Wilderness Companions**
Wilderness means something different to everyone. For our Jewish ancestors, wilderness is exile and wandering; it is a people without a home. For Jesus, whose Jewish roots grounded him in the stories of exile, wilderness was a place of hunger, deprivation, spiritual challenge and resilience. We begin our Lenten journey in the wilderness. What will that mean for you this year?

February 28, 2010 **Lent 2**

Scripture Lessons: Philippians 3:17-4:1 and Luke 13:31-35 Sermon: **The Loneliness of Abuse**
Jesus is threatened; told to get away if he wants to save his life. But he is busy casting out demons and curing the sick and the infirm. He cannot be running away from Herod's violent abuse out of fear when there are so many people who need to be gathered together under his healing and protective wings. His journey to Jerusalem gets more and more intense as we get closer to Good Friday.



Midweek Pause

Midweek Pause meets weekly on **Tuesdays from 5:45pm-6:30pm**. Through meditative chants, silence, prayer and scripture we will prepare ourselves for the sacred journey of wilderness and resurrection. Those who have been attending regularly have described Midweek Pause as a refuge, the upper room, and a time for peace. Take a break from your weekly stress and join us at this worship service from 5:45 PM to 6:30PM.



Spiritual Finance

Monday Evening Bible Study

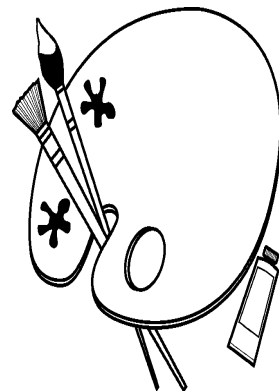

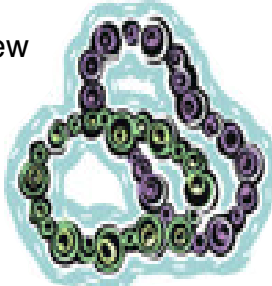

Did you know???

Old Tabernacle Pulpit is Going to Westminster

Will Continue Its Span of Usefulness in Little church on Mohawk Trail;
Made by Israel Fellows in 1854
Salem Evening News September 9, 1930

An act of "long distance" friendliness has come to light with the announcement by the church council of the Tabernacle church that the members of that organization have voted to present to the congregational church of Westminster, Mass the beautiful rosewood pulpit which was in use in the structure razed to make way for the present Tabernacle Church.

The little town of Westminster is located at the entrance to the Mohawk trail, just west of Fitchburg and its thriving church has been a landmark in the religious life of that section since 1739. Some years ago the church was remodeled and its original pulpit disappeared. Since that time the church officials have searched for a colonial pulpit of proper design and following further alteration this year, they learned that the pulpit from the old Tabernacle was in storage awaiting a suitable use.

The builder of this dignified example of the cabinet maker's art was Israel Fellows of Salem, an attendant of Tabernacle church. He operated a shop in the present Newmark building on Essex street in a location probably about where the Kennedy company now has its place of business. He was an expert cabinet maker and in all probability it was there in his shop in 1854 that he built into this plain but artistic pulpit the best traditions of his trade.

From this pulpit the ministers of the Tabernacle spoke their messages for nearly 75 years, and from its confines speakers of state-wide and nation-wide prominence voiced their thoughts at important public meetings. From it also were commissioned the five missionaries to foreign fields in 1912, just 100 years after the first missionaries were sent out. It should be a source of gratification to friends and members of the Tabernacle to know that this integral part of Tabernacle traditions, is to continue its span of usefulness in a new location.

Westminster, Mass., Sept. 23, 1930.
Tabernacle Congregational Church
Salem, Mass.

Greetings: - In business session Sept. 21, 1930, the first Congregational Church of Westminster, Mass., voted unanimously to extend to the Tabernacle Church of Salem, Mass., a special vote of thanks and appreciation for the gift of the old pulpit which you so generously presented us. We are more than delighted with this beautiful piece of church furniture, and prize it as well for the history connected with. We feel that a special tie now binds our two churches together, and we are grateful for it.

The pulpit is already installed and adds so much to the beauty and impressiveness of our church auditorium.

We want to have engraved a suitable silver plate to place on the pulpit, stating a few main facts of its history and recording it as a gift from your church.

We are to re-open our church with a special re-dedicatory service, Sunday, October, 5, at 10:45 AM. We most heartily extend a special invitation to any of the Tabernacle people who might wish to attend this service and see the old pulpit in its new home.; enclosed is a copy of the special letter we are sending out to former friends and members of the Church.

We will be pleased to see any or all of your people at our special service Oct. 5.

Again we assure you of our sincere appreciation for your gift to us.

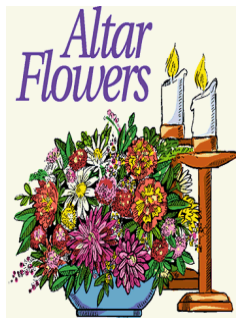

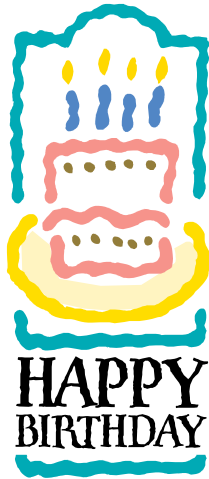
