Dear Members and Friends,

During the months of March and April, we enter the time of Death and Resurrection – the most significant time in our Christian life together. Through the story in Scripture, we find Jesus walking into Jerusalem, fully aware of the dangers he will encounter. Prophets before him suffered and were killed in Jerusalem. He is not naïve. We find the people around Jesus feeling afraid and self-protective. Will his suffering mean that they too must suffer? Their worries and fears inspire doubt, denial, betrayal and flight.

This Lenten pilgrimage is so very human. Who among us doesn't wrestle with the emotions of doubt, fear, and worry? Who among us hasn't encountered denial, betrayal and the choice or decision to run-away rather than fight? The story about Jesus in our scriptures is a portrayal of what it means to be human.

Good Friday brings us into the very heart of humanity: That moment when the heart stops pumping; when the body returns to dust; when the mind shuts down forever. Good Friday is the common denominator between all of us – whether we are rich or poor, educated or self-taught, happy or sad – we all are mortal. We all will die eventually.

And then, God takes over. And then, the Divine presence that also is our common denominator, over rides the pain and sorrow of being so very human. And then, Jesus Christ is risen! And we are set free from the bonds of fear, worry, doubt, denial, betrayal, fight or flight.

Jesus is making a stir on his way to Jerusalem. Stopping for dinner with friends, they can feel the tension of what might be about to happen. Mary opens a bottle of expensive massage oil and anoints his feet with her hair. There is nothing we won't do for someone we love who is dying.

Psalm 126 and John 12:1-8

**March 28, 2010** **Palm Sunday**

Sermon: *There is no Shame in Trusting God*

Jesus rides into Jerusalem on a colt; a symbol of his humanity and humility. His trust in God draws people in to the procession. They lay their cloaks and their palms on the ground before him. "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord."

Scripture Lessons:

Isaiah 50:4-9a and Luke 19:28-40

The resurrection is our constant reminder that life is precious and that each and every one of us matters. And that God revives the most depressed and worrisome from the shadows of oblivion and reunites us with Christ.

### Prayer Shawls

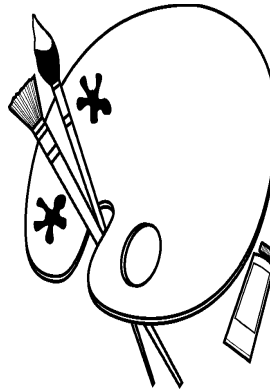

worship expressing themselves through art. The art stations will be located in the balcony and everyone is welcome to participate. There will be an art show on Easter Sunday to display the various works.

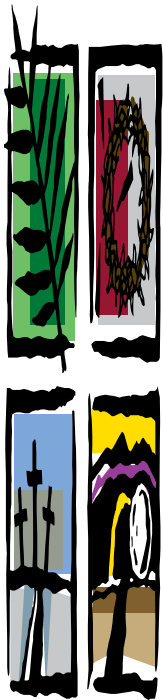

## One Great Hour of Sharing

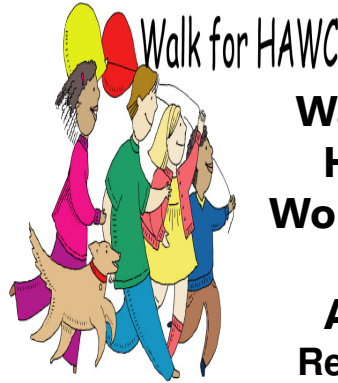
The Annual **One Great Hour of Sharing** Offering will be collected on **Sunday, March 14.**

Welcome to our season of Lent. "Lent is represented by the color purple. It is a time of preparing. Purple is the color of kings. We are preparing for the coming of a king and his going and his coming again. We are preparing for the Mystery of Easter. This is a serious time. It takes six weeks to get ready to enter the Mystery of Easter. Lent helps us get ready. It is a time to know more about the One who is Easter. It is also a time to learn more about who we really are." (from Jerome Berryman's The Mystery of Easter, Godly Play volume III).

But the Mystery of Easter is so great that it can not be contained in one single Sunday, so Easter overflows and goes on for six more Sundays. It makes a whole season. And the Easter season is also the time for getting ready to close to the mystery of Pentecost. (from Jerome Berryman's The Circle of the Church Year, Godly Play Volume II)

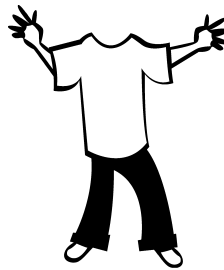

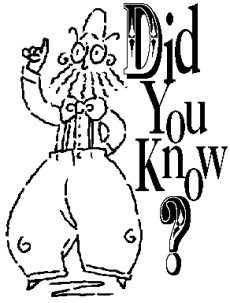

## Did You Know????

### Sites of Meetinghouses and Churches

Two men who came to this new land in an early ship, were Rev. Francis Higginson and Rev. Samuel Skelton. In June of 1629 the ship "passed the curious and difficult entrance into the large, spacious harbor of Naimkecke" from the letters of Francis Higginson. One of the first problems after landing was the organization of a church.

"Hardly had the new ministers arrived than the question of church organization was agitated. July 20, 1629, was appointed for the choice of a pastor and a teacher. After fasting, prayer and a sermon to get themselves into a proper frame of mind, Mr. Skelton was chosen pastor and Mr. Higginson teacher, and was ordained by the laying on of hands of some of the most dignified and important men of the town."

"The first church, for its first building in 1634, occupied a site at the corner of Washington and Essex Streets where it still remained til 1920. Higginson's house, which was standing in 1635, was on Washington St. and somewhat back, but it was erected before the church, which probably occupied some of its land. Skelton's house was nearer the river toward Front St."

" A meeting house is alluded to in 1635; someone was paid for daubing it in 1637, which indicates that it was a wattle and daub structure....A vast amount of ink has been spilled over the question whether the little building behind Plummer Hall contains the original frame of the first church or not...and is probably as good a representation even if not the original"

In 1638 John Pickering was hired to add an addition, which was to be "25 foote longe" and the breadth of the old building.

By 1670 there was a move to have a new meetinghouse. The selectmen ordered that a new meetinghouse sixty by fifty be built at the west end of the old one. "The new meeting house must have been completed by midsummer, in 1672, for the old meeting house was ordered taken down and the timbers stored for future use for the school."

Around 1717 the people living in the eastern part of Salem petitioned for dismissal from the First Church to start their own church. Twenty-six women and ten men were dismissed. Deacon Simon Willard was dismissed with thanks for his great services. This first group of church members to leave the original congregation built their edifice at the corner of what is now Hardy and Essex Streets. Robert Stanton was the first minister and Cotton Mather preached the ordination sermon. A lithograph of this church can be found in *Images of Salem*. It stood on the corner of Essex and Hardy until 1819. The famous diarist and historian Dr. William Bentley (1759-1819) preached there. This church was called the East Church and also Second Church, and this is probably the reason that the church, which eventually became Tabernacle, was called Third Church in 1762.

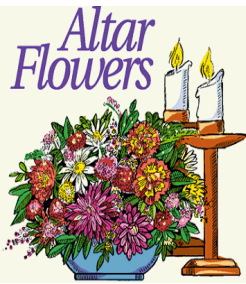


### A Big Thank You...From the Missions Action Group
